On 28 February Jock Mackenzie from James Cook University gave an overview of the preliminary data from the three-year 'MangroveWatch in Oxley Creek' survey program highlighting areas of recovery as well as deterioration. Overall the initial analysis indicates a general improvement in the health of mangroves along Oxley Creek. The final report will be available on the OCCA website later in 2017.

Catchment News

Oxley Creek Vision

On 14 December the Lord Mayor Graeme Quirk announced that a management authority had been established to implement the \$100 million, 20-year Oxley Creek Vision for the 15km stretch of Oxley Creek covering 1830ha between the Brisbane River and the Logan Motorway.

Oxley Creek Transformation will be chaired by South Bank Corporation board member Nigel Chamier. Other Board members will be Bevan Lynch (Architect and chairman of council's planning advisory group the Urban Futures Board), Guy Gibson (Lend Lease General Manager Communities Development and also a member of the Urban Futures Board, and OCCA's Executive Officer Anne Clarke.

We have already had a number of comments from concerned people regarding the Oxley Creek Common, all keen for it to remain as open space for the community and habitat for birds and wildlife.

Despite reports to the contrary, OCCA has not endorsed, neither does it fully support the Vision (refer to www.oxleycreekcatchment.org.au for OCCA's position in the absaence of more detailed information on the Vision.

Recognition for OCCA President

Trevor Armstrong, who became OCCA President at the AGM in November 2016, was presented with an Moreton Australia Day Award by Graham Perrett MLA in recognition of his outstanding voluntary contribution to the community in the Federal electorate of Moreton. Oxley Creek Common

The Lord Mayor has not yet committed to taking a walk around the Oxley Creek Common despite being invited

some 6 months ago. It is difficult to see how he could have developed the Oxley Creek Vision without at least some knowledge of the area and its values.

As the Oxley Creek Common remains State Government land, the Department of State Development is also considering options for its future use and will consult the community. However, this process is very slow and also needs to consider the proposals in the Oxley Creek Vision and the ongoing potential for the Brisbane City Council to take over control and management of the Common.

Release of the Draft SEQ Regional Plan

ShapingSEQ is the Queensland Government's new 50-year regional planning framework which was released in November 2016 for public comment by 3 March 2017. The Brisbane Catchments Network (of which OCCA is a member) made a submission focusing on the lack of attention given to the environment and the absence of any specific targets for enhancement of habitat corridors and retention of bushland.
