General Meetings

On 18 April Andy Hornbuckle of SPEL Environmental gave a fascinating presentation on Floating Wetlands. He outlined the technology, benefits and limitations of this relatively new option for wastewater and stormwater treatment. He illustrated the talk with local examples in Bli Bli, Fraser Island, Bribie Island and Gladstone.

The islands are built from a layered mesh base made from recycled PET bottles which is anchored into place, allowing it to rise and fall with variable water levels, and which is then planted with local *Calyx* species. The islands often become a nesting place for waterbirds and a valuable part of the local environment.

Oxley Creek Transformation

On 14 December the Lord Mayor Graeme Quirk announced that a management authority had been established to implement the \$100 million, 20-year Oxley Creek Vision (now called the Oxley Creek Transformation) for the 15km stretch of Oxley Creek covering 1830ha between the Brisbane River and the Logan Motorway.

Oxley Creek Management Pty Ltd is chaired by South Bank Corporation board member Nigel Chamier. Other Board members aree Bevan Lynch (Architect and chairman of council's planning advisory group the Urban Futures Board), Guy Gibson (Lend Lease General Manager Communities Development and also a member of the Urban Futures Board, and OCCA's Executive Officer Anne Clark. The Board is currently establishing the appropriate legal and governance arrangements.

Oxley Creek Common

The Lord Mayor has not yet committed to taking a walk around the Oxley Creek Common despite being invited some 9 months ago.

As the Oxley Creek Common remains State Government land, the Department of State Development is also considering options for its future use and will consult the community at some stage. However, any future use will need to consider the proposals in the Oxley Creek Transformation and the potential for the Brisbane City Council to take over control and management of the Common in the future.

Aftermath of ex-Cyclone Debbie

Oxley Creek was one of may areas that suffered in the aftermath of Cyclone Debbie. Whilst this area may not have suffered the massive structural damage experienced up north, there was still widespread flooding. Fortunately there does not seem to have been any long-term damage although it may take some time to remove debris, branches or downed trees.

OCCA's project and rehabilitation areas seem to have escaped relatively unscathed and the water in the soil will have benefited our recent plantings.

We all wish Jessica every success in her future career. QUT International Students Renee and Yashin interviewed Jess before she left OCCA. Here are her responses. You can see why we are so sorry to lose her.

What do you think when you look back on your experience working with OCCA

I have enjoyed working here with OCCA, because everyone is so passionate and it's about helping the environment, working with the community to look after the Oxley Creek. I found everyone genuine and helpful. I have enjoyed working here.

Why did you choose to work with OCCA?

When I was in the last year of my university course I found that I enjoyed managing water quality and I did my honours thesis on that. So I was looking for an organisation that was all about water quality management and its health.

How is OCCA different from other organisations you have worked with?

I have worked with some other bush care groups and they basically plant trees, pick out rubbish and pull out weeds. But OCCA is different because we have a good team of workers who go out there and manage the weeds and engage the community in tree planting. It is all lot more about engaging the community and developing a sense of ownership of the area. They are more passionate here.

How is your day spent in OCCA?

Every day is different. One day you will be talking with student interns and another day will be working with industries that are near Oxley Creek to see how we can reduce rubbish in that area, preparing them for flooding events and that kind of thing and organising tree planting events for corporate volunteers.

If you had to choose, which programme is your favourite? I think it probably must be the programmes related in reducing the amount of litter and illegal dumping in the areas because I did industry experience with Brisbane City Council before coming here and we had that kind of informative programme in Council.

How was this journey with your OCCA colleagues?

It's been a great journey. We have been through many events together and everyone comes up with ideas and is so passionate about implementing them, making a difference in the community and involving the community.

What would you change in the way OCCA works to make it better?

I don't think I would change much at all. I think it's just the little things like making our website more valuable for people to look at and making it more interactive like having a map on the website so people can look at what projects are we going on in different locations. Helping them in identifying what things are going on and then what needs to be done for each one, little things like that.

How important is OCCA's work and how can it impact society?

I think Oxley Creek Catchment Association is doing a great job in engaging the community with meetings every second month and we also have a range of bush care groups that work in different areas around Oxley creek catchment. I think we just do great job in engaging the community and improving the health of the environment.

What are you going to miss when you leave OCCA? The people. They are great people to work with.

What message do you have for future volunteers?

OCCA is a great place to work and you can really make a difference to environment and the community.
